DAY 1 - DEPARTURE | OVERNIGHT FLIGHT

After a pilgrimage Mass at an Archdiocese of Washington parish, transfer by motorcoach to Dulles International Airport to catch an evening nonstop flight for an early arrival at Heathrow Airport.

DAY 2 - LONDON

Begin your pilgrimage in the heart of London, where centuries of Catholic faith and witness come alive. You will visit Tyburn Convent, honoring the Tyburn Martyrs who gave their lives for the faith during the Reformation, and continue to Westminster Abbey, whose ancient chapels tell the story of England's Christian past. The day includes Mass at Westminster Cathedral, the mother church of Catholics in England and Wales, with its magnificent Byzantine architecture and shrine of St. John Southworth. After lunch, explore the Tower of London, long associated with saints and martyrs such as St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, before transferring to your hotel for dinner and overnight, reflecting on the courage and fidelity of the saints who sanctified this city.

DAY 3 - CANTERBURY

Today's pilgrimage brings you to Canterbury, one of the most sacred centers of English Christianity. You will visit Canterbury Cathedral, the site of St. Thomas Becket's martyrdom in 1170, where his courageous defense of the Church made him one of Christendom's most venerated saints and a destination for pilgrims for centuries.

The journey continues to St. Augustine's Abbey, founded by St. Augustine of Canterbury, the Apostle to the English, marking the birthplace of English Christianity and the resting place of early bishops and kings. After this profound encounter with the roots of the Faith, you return to your hotel for dinner and overnight, reflecting on the enduring witness of Saints Thomas Becket and Augustine of Canterbury.

DAY 4 - ST. ALBANS | HEREFORD

Begin your day in St. Albans, visiting St. Alban's Cathedral, the site of Britain's first Christian martyr, where pilgrims honor the courageous witness of St. Alban. You then travel to Hereford Cathedral to pray at the shrine of St. Thomas Cantilupe, the saintly medieval bishop known for his pastoral zeal and defense of the Church, and visit nearby St. Ethelbert's Well, commemorating the martyred Anglo-Saxon king. These sacred sites offer a profound reflection on martyrdom, holiness, and England's enduring Christian heritage before continuing to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5 - HARVINGTON | BIRMINGHAM

Begin your day at Harvington Hall, a remarkable recusant manor famed for its priest holes that sheltered Catholic clergy during the Reformation, and reflect on the heroic witness of figures such as St. Nicholas Owen. You then continue to Birmingham to visit the Oratory of St. Philip Neri, associated with Blessed John Henry Newman, and the Basilica of St. Chad, England's first Catholic cathedral built after the Reformation, where you celebrate Mass before transferring to your hotel in Peterborough for dinner and overnight.

DAY 6 - WALSINGHAM

Journey to the Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham, known as “England’s Nazareth,” a Marian shrine dating to 1061 and long revered as a place of prayer, pilgrimage, and healing. You will have time to pray at the Catholic Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, reflecting on the mystery of the Incarnation and England’s enduring devotion to Mary, before continuing north with a lunch stop en route and arriving in Sheffield for dinner and overnight.

DAY 7 - DERBYSHIRE | HOLYWELL

Begin your day at Padley House, honoring the Padley Martyrs who gave their lives for the Catholic faith while secretly ministering during the Reformation. You then travel to the National Shrine of St. Winefride in Holywell, the “Lourdes of Wales,” where you celebrate Mass and pray at the ancient healing well before continuing to York for dinner and overnight.

DAY 8 - YORK

Begin a walking pilgrimage through historic York with visits to the York Oratory and the Shrine of St. Margaret Clitherow, the “Pearl of York,” a wife and mother who was martyred in 1586 for harboring Catholic priests and refusing to betray her faith during the Reformation. You then continue to the Bar Convent Living Heritage Centre, England’s oldest surviving Catholic convent, reflecting on the perseverance and quiet heroism of England’s persecuted Catholics before enjoying a free afternoon and returning to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 9 - NORTH YORKSHIRE | DURHAM | LINDISFARNE

Begin your day at Kiplin Hall, ancestral home of George Calvert, the First Lord Baltimore, whose Catholic faith later shaped Maryland as a refuge for religious freedom. You then visit Durham Cathedral to venerate St. Cuthbert and the Venerable Bede before continuing to Lindisfarne, the cradle of English monasticism, where you celebrate Mass at St. Aidan’s Church, and conclude the day with a transfer to Edinburgh for dinner and overnight.

DAY 10 - DUNFERMLINE | EDINBURGH

Begin your day at Dunfermline Abbey, the resting place of St. Margaret of Scotland, whose holiness and charity profoundly shaped the Church and nation. You then return to Edinburgh to visit Edinburgh Castle and St. Mary’s Catholic Cathedral, the spiritual heart of the Archdiocese, where you reflect on Scotland’s deep Catholic roots and the enduring witness of saints such as St. Margaret and St. Columba.

DAY 11 - RETURN HOME

Depart Edinburgh on an early afternoon flight to Washington Dulles. Upon arrival in the United States, you’ll be met by your motorcoach for the final leg of your journey, returning together to the parish from which you first set out—bringing your pilgrimage full circle.
